

Meet the Teacher Evening

We hope you found the 'Meet the Teacher' sessions informative.

We also have other Staff in School available to offer support to you and your child. Our School Nurse, Michelle Perryman is based at Ottery Hospital and works closely with School to support children with any medical needs. Our Pastoral Manager, Anna Vine is based in School and works Monday-Wednesday and Friday. Her role in school is to provide support, advice and information to the families within our school community. She can help you with any worries that you may have in relation to your child's education, behaviour and wellbeing. Please feel free to contact Anna via the school office to make an appointment; Anna is also usually available at the school gate in the mornings.

First day of absence contact

As part of our safeguarding practice, we are in the process of amending our attendance policy in light of recommendations made following a serious case review to ensure:

- we hold at least three phone numbers for different adults
- a member of staff visits the family home when contact cannot be made by phone with the parent of an expectedly absent child and if there is no answer, we will contact the police.

This will enable schools to contact all named contacts of children who are absent and for whom no reason has been given to ascertain the reason for absence and ensure the safety of the child. This

contact will occur on the first day of absence; if it is not possible to establish contact by telephone, a member of staff will visit the family home and if there is no answer, the police will be contacted immediately to check the safety and wellbeing of the family.

If your child is absent from school for any reason, please ensure you report their absence promptly on the first day of absence to avoid unnecessary telephone contacts or visits to you to ascertain the reason for their absence.

We have written to all parents and carers of children for whom we only hold contact details for 2 adults to request additional contact details for a third person, if you have received a letter requesting this information, please ensure it is returned to the school office by Monday 25th September.
